The Boeing Co., St. Louis, Missouri, is awarded an \$880,000,000 firm-fixed-price, cost-plus-fixed-fee, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract that provides for the procurement, modernization, and sustainment of P-8A Poseidon aircrew and maintenance training systems, including the development, integration, testing, delivery, and installation of new training devices and upgrades to existing trainers, as well as associated hardware, software, spares, and support services, in support of Navy fleet readiness and evolving aircraft configurations, mission systems, and training requirements. Work will be performed in St. Louis, Missouri (80%); Jacksonville, Florida (8%); Oak Harbor, Washington (2%); Edinburgh, South Australia (2%), Lossiemouth IV31 6SD, United Kingdom (1%); Ohakea, New Zealand (1%); Gyeonsangnam-Do, South Korea (1%), Wurster Nordseeküste, Germany (1%); Greenwood, Nova Scotia, Canada (1%); Comox, British Columbia, Canada (1%); Singapore (1%); and Trondheim, Norway (1%), and is expected to be completed by June 2031. No funds will be obligated at the time of award; funds will be obligated on individual orders as they are issued. This contract was not competed.
