ARMY

Lockheed Martin Corp., Grand Prairie, Texas, was awarded a \$8,402,489,648 modification (P00007) to contract W31P4Q-25-D-0010 to increase the ceiling and extend the ordering period for increased production capacity of Precision Strike Missiles Increment One and procurement of Early Operational Capability assets, follow-on production, development, and obsolescence management through fiscal 2032. The modification brings the total cumulative face value of the contract to \$13,339,535,048.

Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of Sept. 30, 2032. Army Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, is the contracting activity.

TRU Simulation + Training, Goose Creek, South Carolina, was awarded a \$396,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract for the Family of Maintenance Trainers indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity contract, including analysis, design, development, production, installation, integration, test, concurrency upgrades, technology refresh, trainer modifications, skills sustainment, cybersecurity, and instruction to support program-specific delivery orders. Bids were solicited via the internet with 23 received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of June 23, 2033. Army Contracting Command, Orlando, Florida, is the contracting activity (W900KK-26-D-A022).

Structural Engineering Group Inc., Hamilton, Virginia, was awarded a \$200,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract for maintenance, repair, and construction services in support of Tobyhanna Army Depot under an indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity, multiple award, task order contract consisting of a five-year ordering period. Bids were solicited via the internet with 44 received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of Sept. 29, 2031. Army Contracting Command, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Tobyhanna, Pennsylvania, is the contracting activity (W51AA1-26-D-A037).

Dills Architects Raymond JV LLC,* Virginia Beach, Virginia (W91236-26-D-A001); GMHILL BAKER JV LLC,* Jacksonville, Florida (W91236-26-D-A002); and Zapata Group Inc.,* Charlotte, North Carolina (W91236-26-D-A003), will compete for each order of the \$45,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract to provide a broad range of architect and engineering services to support construction projects located primarily in the Norfolk District area of responsibility, but also the North Atlantic Division. This total cumulative face value is \$45,000,000. Bids were solicited via the internet with 22 received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of June 22, 2031. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Norfolk, Virginia, is the contracting activity.

Tepa-Weston JV, Kansas City, Missouri, was awarded a \$14,060,476 firm-fixed-price contract for rehabilitation, design, and construction of the detention basins and surrounding area at the Hawthorne Army Depot New Bomb Open Detonation Range, including removal of all material potentially presenting an explosive hazard and unexploded ordnance, and redesign of stormwater detention basins to withstand a 500-year flood event and control offsite discharge from a 100-year event or the worst storm event on record. Bids were solicited via the internet with one received. Work will be performed in Hawthorne, Nevada, with an estimated completion date of May 31, 2028. Fiscal 2026 other procurement, Army funds in the amount of \$14,060,476 were obligated at the time of the award. Army Contracting Command, Rock Island Arsenal, Illinois, is the contracting activity (W519TC-26-C-A042).

AIR FORCE

The Boeing Co., El Segundo, California, has been awarded a maximum \$2,002,862,607 fixed-price-incentive-firm-target contract for the Mobile User Objective System (MUOS) service life extension Phase II effort. This contract provides for the design, development, build, launch support, and on-orbit test support of two MUOS satellites. Work will be performed in El Segundo, California, and is expected to be completed by Sept. 30, 2035. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and two offers were received. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation funds in the amount of \$204,083,073 are being obligated at time of award. Space Systems Command, Los Angeles Air Force Base, California, is the contracting activity (FA8807-26-C-B006). (Awarded on June 22, 2026)

STS Government Solutions LLC, San Antonio, Texas, has been awarded a ceiling \$53,470,084 firm-fixed-price contract for operation support services. This contract provides for mission support for cyber defense, network security, and information protection for the 33rd Cyber Operations Squadron. Work will be performed at Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, Texas, and is expected to be completed by Aug. 31, 2030. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and 127 offers were received. Fiscal

2026 operation and maintenance funds in the amount of \$3,805,297 are being obligated at time of award. The Air Combat Command Acquisition Management and Integration Center, Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma, is the contracting activity (FA8773-26-D-0001). (Awarded on June 22, 2026) Advanced Concepts Enterprises Inc., Fort Walton Beach, Florida, has been awarded a \$13,628,667 hybrid firm-fixed-price, labor-hour, and cost-reimbursement task order for intelligence security support services. This contract provides for contractor support to deliver specialized subject matter expertise to Air Force intelligence programs. Work will be performed at Hurlburt Field, Florida, and is expected to be completed by Jan. 15, 2031. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and seven offers were received. Fiscal 2026 operations and maintenance funds in the amount of \$1,451,963 are being obligated at time of award. The Air Force Installation Contracting Center, 765th Enterprise Sourcing Flight, Hurlburt Field, Florida, is the contracting activity (FA0021-26-F-0006). (Awarded on June 22, 2026)

Zone 5 Technologies LLC, San Luis Obispo, California, has been awarded a \$12,362,281 firm-fixed-price small business innovation and research Phase III contract for the Rusty Dagger Franchise. This contract will provide research and development on a manufacturing technology. Work will be performed at Miamisburg, Ohio, and is expected to be completed by September 2027. This contract is a sole source Small Business Innovation Research Phase III acquisition. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation funds in the amount of \$7,500,000 are being obligated at time of award. Air Force Research Laboratory, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, is the contracting activity (FA2385-26-C-B019). (Awarded on June 18, 2026)

Credence Dynamo Solutions LLC, Vienna, Virginia, has been awarded an \$11,792,724 modification (P00007) to a previously awarded contract (FA4890-24-F-0071) to exercise Option Year Two for intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance services support. This modification brings the total cumulative face value of the contract to \$28,612,601 from \$16,819,877. Work will be performed at Shaw Air Force Base, South Carolina, and is expected to be completed by July 15, 2029. Fiscal 2026 operation and maintenance funds in the amount of \$11,424,810 are being obligated at time of award. Air Combat Command Acquisition Management & Integration Center, Langley AFB, Virginia, is the contracting activity. (Awarded on June 17, 2026)

Boecore LLC, Colorado Springs, Colorado, has been awarded a \$10,634,426 firm-fixed-price contract for advanced data solutions for complex spectrum analysis and systems validation. This contract provides for a deployable radio frequency data analysis and signal environment generation platform to support test and training infrastructure. Work will be performed at Colorado Springs, Colorado, and is expected to be completed by June 30, 2028. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and eight offers were received. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation funds in the amount of \$1,616,000 are being obligated at time of award. Space Systems Command, Colorado Springs, Colorado, is the contracting activity (FA2553-26-C-B009). (Awarded June 22, 2026)

NAVY

Innovative Defense Technologies LLC,* Arlington, Virginia, was awarded on June 18 a \$157,212,161 cost-plus-fixed-fee, cost-no-fee, and firm-fixed-price contract for Automated Test and Re-Test engineering, design, development, implementation, and test support requirements. This contract includes options which, if exercised, would bring the cumulative value of this contract to \$748,572,910. Work will be performed in Arlington, Virginia (62%); Mount Laurel, New Jersey (32%); San Diego, California (5%); and various other locations (1%), and is expected to be completed by June 2027. If all options are exercised, work will continue through June 2031. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation (Navy) funds in the amount of \$43,253,537 (96%); fiscal 2026 operations and maintenance (Navy) funds in the amount of \$963,000 (2%); and fiscal 2025 other procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$712,219 (2%), will be obligated at time of award; of which \$963,000 will expire at end of the current fiscal year. This contract was not competitively procured in accordance with 10 U.S. Code 3204(a)(5) (authorized by statute). The Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, D.C., is the contracting activity (N00024-26-C-5380). (Awarded on June 18, 2026).

Design West Technologies,* Tustin, California (N0017426D1008); and HDT Expeditionary Systems Inc., Solon, Ohio (N0017426D1010), are each awarded a firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity, multiple award contract for M98 gas-particulate filter sets. The maximum dollar value for both contracts combined is \$53,000,000 for a five-year ordering period. Work will be performed in Tustin, California; and Solon, Ohio, and is expected to be completed by

June 2031. Fiscal 2026 operations and maintenance (Navy) funding in the total amount of \$5,706,955 will be obligated at the time of award and will expire at the end of the fiscal year. All other funding will be made available at the delivery order level as contracting actions occur. This action was awarded on a sole source basis under the authority of 10 U.S. Code 3204(a)(1) as implemented by Federal Acquisitions Regulation 6.302-1 - a limited number of responsible sources and no other supplies or services will satisfy agency requirements. The Naval Surface Warfare Center, Indian Head Division, Indian Head, Maryland, is the contracting activity.

Bell Textron Inc., Fort Worth, Texas, is being awarded \$43,215,352 for an undefinitized contract action delivery order (N00383-26-F-0083) under previously awarded basic ordering agreement N00383-22-G-ZL01 for the procurement of 32 gearboxes in support of H-1 helicopters sold to the Czech Republic under the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) program. All work will be performed in Fort Worth, Texas, and work will be completed by June 2030. This contract involves FMS funds to the Czech Republic (100%). FMS funds (Czech Republic) in the amount of \$21,175,522 (49%) will be obligated at time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. Subsequent funding to definitize the requirement will be funded with appropriate FMS funds (Czech Republic). One company was solicited for this sole-source requirement pursuant to the authority set forth in 10 U.S. Code 2304 (c)(1) and one offer received. Naval Supply Systems Command Weapon Systems Support, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is the contracting activity.

Northrop Grumman Systems Corp., San Diego, California, is awarded a \$23,399,824 cost-plus-fixed-fee and firm-fixed-price order (N0001926F1093) against a previously issued basic ordering agreement (N0001925G0003). This contract procures one retrofit kit necessary to retrofit the MQ-4C Triton Unmanned Air Vehicle B7 to an integrated functional configuration 4.2.3 and one retrofit kit necessary to retrofit the MQ-4C Triton Unmanned Aircraft System Main Operating Base-2 to an integrated function configuration 4.2.4; 6 months of preservation and storage for the MQ-4 Triton UAS Air Vehicle B7; and non-recurring engineering to support the retrofit of MQ-4C Triton UAS Air Vehicle B7 and retrofit of MQ-4C Triton UAS Main Operating Base MB-2. Work will be performed in Palmdale, California (61%); San Diego, California (35%); Whidbey Island, Washington (2%); and various other locations within the continental U.S. each under 1% (2%), and is expected to be completed in April 2030. Fiscal 2025 aircraft procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$9,777,741; fiscal 2026 aircraft procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$13,498,908; and fiscal 2026 operations and maintenance (Navy) funds in the amount of \$123,175, will be obligated at the time of award; \$123,175 of which will expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This order was not competed. Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, Maryland, is the contracting activity. The Boeing Co., via The Bell Boeing Joint Project Office, Ridley Park, Pennsylvania, is being awarded \$16,224,988 for a firm-fixed-price contract for the procurement of 25 structural ring assemblies, commonly known as the flex ring, utilized in Marine Corps V-22 Osprey aircraft. The contract does not contain an option provision and work will be completed by October 2032. Work will be performed in Sante Fe Springs, California (90%); and Ridley Park, Pennsylvania (10%). Fiscal 2026 working capital funds (Navy) in the contract's full amount of \$16,224,988 will be obligated at time of award and those funds will not expire at the end of the applicable fiscal year. One company was solicited for this sole-source requirement pursuant to the authority set forth in 10 U.S. Code 3204 (a)(1) with one offer received. Naval Supply Systems Command Weapon Systems Support, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is the contracting activity (N00383-26-C-TA04).

L3Harris Technologies Communication Systems - West, Salt Lake City, Utah, is being awarded a \$12,220,633 firm-fixed-price modification to a previously awarded contract (N00024-23-C-5206) to exercise the option to develop, test, manufacture, deliver, manage, and support the AN/SRQ-4 Radio Terminal Set Common Data Link Hawklink on Navy surface combatants. This contract combines purchases from the Navy (20%); and the government of Spain (80%), under the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) program. Work will be performed in Salt Lake City, Utah and is expected to be completed by June 2028. FMS (Spain) funding in the amount of \$9,752,500 (80%); and fiscal 2026 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funding in the amount of \$2,468,133 (20%), will be obligated at the time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, D.C., is the contracting activity.

DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY

Baxters North America Inc., Cincinnati, Ohio, has been awarded a maximum \$66,645,000 fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for both the cold and hot modular operational ration

enhancement. This was a competitive acquisition with three responses received. This is a five-year contract with no option periods. The ordering period end date is June 23, 2031. Using military services are Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps. Type of appropriation is fiscal 2026 through 2031 defense working capital funds. The contracting activity is Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (SPE3S1-26-D-Z100).
