AIR FORCE

Vertex Aerospace LLC, Madison, Mississippi, has been awarded a ceiling \$500,000,000 firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for contractor logistic support services for the Air Force C-12 aircraft fleet. This contract provides time-sensitive movement of personnel, cargo, and medical evacuation, as well as test support for Air Force Materiel Command, Defense Intelligence Agency, Defense Security Cooperation Agency, and Pacific Air Forces. Work will be performed at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska; Edwards Air Force Base, California; Joint Base Andrews, Maryland; Madison, Mississippi; Holloman Air Force Base, New Mexico; Okmulgee, Oklahoma; San Angelo, Texas; Buenos Aires, Argentina; Gaborone, Botswana; Brasilia, Brazil; Bogota, Colombia; Cairo, Egypt; Accra, Ghana; Tegucigalpa, Honduras; Budapest, Hungary; Yokota Air Base, Japan; Nairobi, Kenya; Rabat, Morocco; Manila, Philippines; Riyadh, Saudi Arabia; Bangkok, Thailand; Ankara, Turkey; and Oslo, Norway, and is expected to be completed by June 30, 2031. This contract involves Foreign Military Sales. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and three offers were received. Fiscal 2026 operation and maintenance funds in the amount of \$237,125; fiscal 2026 research, development, test, and evaluation funds in the amount of \$7,250; and Foreign Military Sales funds in the amount of \$5,659 are being obligated at time of award. The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma, is the contracting activity (FA8134-26-D-B004).

VSE Tek, Taunton, Massachusetts, has been awarded a ceiling \$9,909,176 firm-fixed-price contract for climatology quick reaction capabilities. This contract provides expert systems integration, cybersecurity, software development, and policy support to update weather data systems. Work will be performed at Hanscom Air Force Base, Massachusetts; Offutt Air Force Base, Nebraska; and Asheville, North Carolina; and is expected to be completed by June 24, 2027. This contract was a sole source acquisition. Fiscal 2025 research, development, test, and evaluation funds in the amount of \$1,263,176; fiscal 2026 research, development, test, and evaluation funds in the amount of \$2,839,135; and fiscal 2026 operation and maintenance funds in the amount of \$1,519,000 are being obligated at time of award. The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, Electronic Systems Directorate Contracting, Hanscom Air Force Base, Massachusetts, is the contracting activity (FA2330-26-C-B008). (Awarded June 25, 2026)

NAVY

Space Ground System Solutions, Inc, Melbourne, FL, is being awarded a \$245,000,000 cost-plus-fixed-fee indefinite delivery indefinite quantity contract for US Naval Research Laboratory Blossom Point Tracking Facility satellite software and operations support. The contract provides information technology infrastructure support and cybersecurity related to the development of software systems. The base IDIQ contains no options and has a ceiling of \$245,000,000. Two cost-plus-fixed-fee task orders will be issued concurrently. The task orders include options and have a cumulative value of \$217,484,999. Work will be performed at the U.S. Naval Research Laboratory, Washington, District of Columbia, and is expected to be completed by June 2031. Fiscal year 2026 research, development, test and evaluation (Navy) funding in the amount of \$2,726,709 will be obligated at the time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract was competitively procured with one offer received via Contract Opportunities on SAM.gov. The U.S. Naval Research Laboratory, Washington, District of Columbia, is the contracting activity (N0017326D2425, N0017326F2408 and N0017326F2409).

Lockheed Martin Corp., Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Co., Fort Worth, Texas, is awarded a \$74,220,041 cost-plus-incentive-fee definitization modification (P00134) to a previously awarded contract (N0001919C0010). This modification definitizes four contract line items to provide United Kingdom and Italy unique weapons systems integration through system functional review to development test complete on the F-35A and F-35B aircraft in support of continued development of critical F-35 Block Four warfighting capabilities for the Joint Strike Fighter program. Additionally, this action also includes common partner scope for a tactical data recorder for F-35A, F-35B, and F-35C. Work will be performed in Samlesbury, United Kingdom (51%), Fort Worth, Texas (24%), Orlando, Florida (10%), El Segundo, California (5%), Baltimore, Maryland (5%), Nashua, New Hampshire (1%), various locations within the continental U.S. (2%), various locations outside the continental U.S. (2%) and is expected to be completed in December 2032. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation (Air Force) funds in the amount of \$500,000; fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation (Navy) funds in the amount of \$500,000; and non-U.S. DoD partner funds in the

amount of \$187,336,521 will be obligated at the time of award, none of which will expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract action was not competed. The Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, Maryland, is the contracting activity.

Lockheed Martin Corporation, Manassas, Virginia is awarded a \$51,764,071 cost-plus-incentive-fee modification to previously awarded contract (N00024-18-C-6258) for production of the Integrated Submarine Imaging System for new construction and in-service submarines. This contract modification includes options which, if exercised, would bring the cumulative value of this contract modification to \$63,397,435. L3 Technologies, Inc, Northampton Massachusetts, is awarded a \$44,166,206 firm-fixed-price modification to previously awarded contract (N00024-21-C-5322) for the procurement of additional MK 20 Mod 1 Electro-Optical Sensor Systems and spares in support of Arleigh Burke-class ships and allied navies. Work will be performed in Northampton, Massachusetts and is expected to be completed by June 2029. Fiscal 2025 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$11,528,361 (26%); foreign military sales (Australia) funds in the amount of \$7,591,451 (17%); foreign military sales (Japan) funds in the amount of \$6,855,360 (16%); foreign military sales (Canada) funds in the amount of \$6,855,360 (16%); fiscal 2024 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$4,255,021 (10%); fiscal 2025 other procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$2,553,876 (6%); fiscal 2023 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$2,475,233 (5%); and fiscal 2026 other procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$2,051,544 (4%) will be obligated at time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, D.C., is the contracting activity.

Lockheed Martin Corp., Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Co., Fort Worth, Texas, is awarded a \$23,324,676 firm fixed price modification (P00018) to previously awarded order (N0001923F0002) against a previously issued basic ordering agreement (N0001919G0008). This delivery order is for the procurement of material modification kits to support the F-35 Joint Strike Fighter aircraft retrofit and modification efforts for the Air Force, Marines, Navy, and non-U.S. Department of Defense (DOD) participants. Work will be performed in Fort Worth, Texas and is expected to be completed by March 2030. Fiscal 2024 aircraft procurement (Marine Corps) funds in the amount of \$ 2,260,065; fiscal 2024 aircraft procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$1,191,211; fiscal 2024 aircraft procurement (Air Force) funds in the amount of \$ 8,326,556; non-U.S. DoD participants funds in the amount of \$9,999,329; and Foreign Military Sales Customers funds in the amount of \$1,547,515 will be obligated at the time of award, of which \$11,777,832 will expire at the end of the current fiscal year. The Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, Maryland, is the contracting activity.

Overland AI Inc., Seattle, Washington, is awarded a \$19,744,499 firm-fixed-price, cost plus fixed fee, and cost reimbursement Other Transaction Agreement (OTA) to a previously awarded prototype OTA (HQ0845-23-9-0066) for the procurement of Military-Unmanned Ground Vehicles (MUGVs) in support of Program Manager Ground Based Air Defense, Marine Air Defense Integrated System. The

agreement provides for the procurement of MUGVs and associated OverWatch/OverDrive software, spares, and services. Work will be performed in Seattle, Washington (100%). The delivery of supplies will be on or before Oct. 26, 2027. Fiscal 2026 procurement (Marine Corps) funds in the amount of \$16,897,683 will be obligated at the time of award.
