KTH Services JV LLC,* Colorado Springs, Colorado, is awarded a \$34,950,653 firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for base operations support services at Naval Station Mayport, Jacksonville, Florida. This contract provides for base operations support services to include port operations, facility management, facility investment, custodial, pest control, integrated solid waste management, grounds maintenance and landscaping, pavement clearance, utilities management, electrical, wastewater, water, base support vehicles and equipment, and environmental. Work will be performed in Jacksonville, Florida, and is expected to be completed by December 2027. The maximum dollar value, including the base period and seven option periods, is \$279,526,486. No funds will be obligated at time of award.
