Lockheed Martin Corp., Liverpool, New York, was awarded a \$2,998,742,163 fixed-price-incentive, cost-plus-fixed-fee, cost-no-fee contract for Sentinel A4 radar production and engineering services. Bids were solicited via the internet with one received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of June 29, 2031. Army Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, is the contracting activity (W31P4Q-26-D-0016).

The Oak Group Inc., Camden, New Jersey, was awarded a \$200,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract for maintenance, repair, and construction services. Bids were solicited via the internet with 44 received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of Sept. 28, 2031. Army Contracting Command, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, is the contracting activity (W51AA1-26-D-A040).

General Electric Co., Lynn, Massachusetts, was awarded a \$77,780,000 cost-plus-incentive-fee contract for continued engineering and manufacturing development efforts under the Improved Turbine Engine Program. The amount of this action brings the total cumulative face value of the contract to \$963,769,255. Bids were solicited via the internet with two received. Work will be performed in Lynn, Massachusetts, with an estimated completion date of Dec. 31, 2029. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test, and evaluation, Army funds in the amount of \$77,780,000 were obligated at the time of the award. Army Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, is the contracting activity (W58RGZ-19-C-0003 P00109).

Agate Construction Co. Inc., Egg Harbor Township, New Jersey, was awarded a firm-fixed-price contract for North Jetty repairs at Indian River Inlet. The amount of this action is \$53,000,000 with a total cumulative face value of \$55,400,000. Bids were solicited via the internet with one received. Work will be performed in Bethany Beach, Delaware, with an estimated completion date of Oct. 31, 2028. Fiscal 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2026 civil operation and maintenance funds in the amount of \$53,000,000 were obligated at the time of the award. (W912HN-26-D-A010); Dewberry Engineers Inc., Fairfax, Virginia (W912HN-26-D-A011); AECOM Technical Services Inc., Los Angeles, California (W912HN-26-D-A012); Kimley-Hanson-Bergmann JV, West Palm Beach, Florida (W912HN-26-D-A013); and Michael Baker International Inc., Jacksonville, Florida (W912HN-26-D-A015), will compete for each order of the \$49,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract for disaster response, emergency repair, and infrastructure stabilization or reconstruction missions across civil works, military, and international and interagency services programs. Bids were solicited via the internet with five received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of June 30, 2031. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Savannah, Georgia, is the contracting activity.

Bids were solicited via the internet with one received. Work locations and funding will be determined with each order, with an estimated completion date of June 30, 2027. U. S. J. F. Brennan Co. Inc., La Crosse, Wisconsin, was awarded a \$43,671,933 firm-fixed-price contract for removal of existing riprap, installation of a sheet pile separator wall, and associated dredging and fill operations at a lock and dam. Bids were solicited via the internet with two received. Work will be performed in Winfield, Missouri, with an estimated completion date of Dec. 25, 2027. Fiscal 2026 civil construction funds in the amount of \$43,671,933 were obligated at the time of the award. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis, Missouri, is the contracting activity (W912P9-26-C-A007).

Huntsville Rehabilitation Foundation - Phoenix, Huntsville, Alabama, was awarded a \$11,738,265 firm-fixed-price contract for access control, badging, and mail. beverage items. This was a competitive acquisition with two responses received. This is a five-year contract with no option periods. The ordering period end date is June 28, 2031. Using military service is Navy. Type of appropriation is fiscal 2026 through 2031 defense working capital funds. The contracting activity is Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (SPE300-26-D-3018).

US Vanadium LLC,* Hot Springs National Park, Arkansas (SP8000-26-D-0015) and Largo Resources USA Inc.,* McLean, Virginia (SP8000-26-D-0016) are sharing a maximum \$125,000,000 firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract under solicitation (SP8000-26-R-0013) for Vanadium Pentoxide. This was a sole-source acquisition using justification 10 U.S. Code 3204 (a)(3)(A), as implemented in the Federal Acquisition Regulation 6.103-3 (b)(1). These are five-year contracts with no option periods. The performance completion date is June 21, 2031. Using military services are Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, and Space Force. Type of appropriation is fiscal 2026 through 2031 transaction funds. The contracting activity is Defense Logistics Agency Contracting Services Office, Columbus, Ohio. (Awarded on June 22, 2026)

Salute Industries Inc., Archdale, North Carolina, has been awarded a maximum \$48,346,120 firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for men's and women's dress coats. This was a competitive acquisition with five responses received. This is a five-year contract with no option periods. The performance completion date is June 29, 2031. Using military service is Air Force. Type of appropriation is fiscal 2026 through 2031 defense working capital funds. The contracting activity is Defense Logistics Agency Troop Support, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (SPE1C1-26-D-0061).

Northrop Grumman Systems Corp., El Segundo, California, has been awarded a maximum \$9,425,888 modification (P00001) to a delivery order (SPE4A5-25-F-7810) issued against a two-year subsumable contract (SPE4AX-21-D-P002) with one five-year option period for LEX L/H wing extensions. This is a firm-fixed-price contract. The delivery order completion date is July 7, 2028.

Using military service is Air Force. Type of appropriation is fiscal 2026 defense working capital funds. The contracting activity is Defense Logistics Agency Weapons Support, Richmond, Virginia.

NAVY

Lockheed Martin Corporation, Moorestown, New Jersey, was awarded a \$103,900,000 cost-only undefinitized contract action to procure the critical initial efforts for long-lead material procurement, early engineering supports, and test site establishment in support of the Spain F-100 mid-life upgrade program for the Spanish Navy Alvaro de Bazan-class frigates. This contract involves foreign military sales to the Kingdom of Spain. Work will be performed in Moorestown, New Jersey (90%); Clearwater, Florida (7%); Madrid, Spain (2%); and Owego, New York (1%), and is expected to be completed by June 2027. Foreign Military Sales (Spain) appropriation account funding in the amount of \$51,399,999 will be obligated at time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract was not competitively procured in accordance with the authority from 10 U.S. Code 3204(a)(4) (International Agreement). Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, D.C., is the contracting activity (N00024-26-C-5102). (Awarded June 26, 2026)

Lockheed Martin Rotary and Mission Systems, Moorestown, New Jersey, is awarded a \$73,681,472 firm-fixed-price modification to previously awarded contract (N00024-23-C-5325) to exercise options for MK 41 Vertical Launching System modules and ancillary equipment. Work will be performed in Moorestown, New Jersey (31%); Indianapolis, Indiana (27%); Saginaw, Michigan (7%); Farmingdale, New York (6%); St. Peters, Missouri (3%); San Jose, California (2%); Radford, Virginia (1%); and various other locations (23%), and is expected to be completed by December 2030. Fiscal 2026 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$56,093,952 (76%); and fiscal 2025 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$17,587,520 (24%), will be obligated at time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, D.C., is the contracting activity.

Environmental Chemical Corporation, Burlingame, California, is awarded a \$66,362,841

firm-fixed-price construction contract for P1556 10th Marines Maintenance and Operations Complex. Work will be performed at Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, and is expected to complete by August 2029. The maximum dollar value, including the base price and six options, is \$66,362,841. Fiscal 2024 military construction (Navy) funds in the amount of \$35,000,000 for the first increment will be obligated at the time of the award and will not expire at the end of the fiscal year. This contract was competitively procured via sam.gov with four offers received. Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command Mid-Atlantic, Norfolk, Virginia, is the contracting activity (N40085-26-C-0014).

Dignitas Technologies LLC, Orlando, Florida, is awarded a \$49,500,000 firm-fixed-price, cost-plus-fixed-fee, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract that provides for the development, procurement, modernization, technical refresh, and sustainment of Navy Surface and Undersea training devices, training systems, and associated courseware and curriculum in support of evolving fleet training requirements and maintaining operational readiness for the Navy. These efforts support Small Business Innovation Research, topic N252-112, titled "Generative Artificial Intelligence for Course and Content Creation and Conversion". Work will be performed in Orlando, Florida, and is expected to be completed by June 2029. No funds will be obligated at the time of award; funds will be obligated on individual orders as they are issued. This contract was not competed. Naval Air Warfare Center Training Systems Division, Orlando, Florida, is the contracting activity (N6134026D1009).

BAE Systems Information and Electronic Systems Integration Inc., Nashua, New Hampshire, is awarded a \$40,942,400 firm-fixed-price modification (P00021) to previously awarded contract (N0001923C0029). This modification exercises an option for the procurement of 200 Dual Band Decoy countermeasures and associated assemblies for the Navy. Work will be performed in Nashua, New Hampshire (70.8%); Wenatchee, Washington (4.5%); Fremont, California (3.7%); Hopkinton, Massachusetts (2.8%); Newark, Delaware (2.2%); Keene, New Hampshire (2.1%); Wilmington, Massachusetts (1.7%); and various locations within the continental U.S. (12.2%), and is expected to be completed in November 2028. Fiscal 2025 procurement of ammunition, (Navy and Marine Corps) funds in the amount of \$15,148,688; and fiscal 2026 procurement of ammunition, (Navy and Marine Corps) funds in the amount of \$25,793,712, will be obligated at the time of award. The base contract was competitively procured. Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, Maryland, is the contracting activity.

Hornady Manufacturing Co.,* Grand Island, Nebraska, is awarded a \$35,410,312 firm-fixed-price, indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for 7.62mm special long-range, MK 316 MOD 0 ammunition. This contract does not include options. Work will be performed in Grand Island, Nebraska, and is expected to be completed by June 2031. Fiscal 2026 Procurement of Ammunition (Navy and Marine Corps) funding in the amount of \$3,506,850 (87%); and fiscal 2025 procurement of ammunition (Navy and Marine Corps) funding in the amount of \$536,820 (13%), will be obligated at the time of award and will not expire at the end of the current fiscal year. This contract was competitively procured on the basis of Small Business Set-Aside, and five offers were received via the Procurement Integrated Enterprise Environment Solicitation Module. Naval Surface Warfare Center, Crane Division, Crane, Indiana is the contracting activity (N0016426DJN21).

Rockwell Collins Simulation and Training Solutions LLC, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is awarded a \$21,245,490 firm-fixed-price contract for the procurement of technical refreshes and capability upgrades to existing E-2D Hawkeye training systems, including enhancements to flight trainers, system integration laboratories, Special Projects Advanced Readiness Trainer Afloat/Ashore devices, Joint Simulation Environment integration, distributed mission testing capabilities, virtual maintenance training, instructor/operator training, and associated technical documentation in support of maintaining current training capabilities and fleet readiness for the Navy. Work will be performed in Sterling, Virginia (45%); Norfolk, Virginia (20%); Tampa, Florida (20%); Point Mugu, California (10%); and Iwakuni, Japan (5%), and is expected to be completed by June 2028. Fiscal 2026 aircraft procurement (Navy) in the amount of \$16,154,457; fiscal 2025 aircraft procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$4,711,490; and fiscal 2024 aircraft procurement (Navy) funds in the amount of \$379,543. This contract was not competed pursuant to 10 U.S. Code 3204(a)(1). Naval Air Warfare Center Training Systems Division, Orlando, Florida, is the contracting activity (N6134026C1001).

General Atomics, San Diego, California, is awarded a \$13,899,848 modification (P00117) to a firm-fixed-price contract (N0001914C0037). This modification adds scope for the procurement of Electromagnetic Aircraft Launch System power conversion subsystem components, hardware

retrofits, and position sensor upgrades for USS Enterprise (CVN-80) future Gerald R. Ford-class aircraft carrier, including upgrades to half bridge and braking chopper assemblies, in support of improving system reliability, maintainability, and operational readiness for the Navy. Work will be performed in San Diego, California (40.6%); Tupelo, Mississippi (34.1%); and Cleveland, Ohio (25.3%), and is expected to be completed in April 2029. Fiscal 2026 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$13,801,446; and fiscal 2023 shipbuilding and conversion (Navy) funds in the amount of \$98,402, will be obligated at the time of award. This contract was not competed. Naval Air Systems Command, Patuxent River, Maryland, is the contracting activity.

AIR FORCE

The Boeing Co., Heath, Ohio, was awarded a \$49,500,000 indefinite-delivery/indefinite-quantity contract for Air Launched Cruise Missile (ALCM) controller remanufacture. This contract is to produce production test sets and remanufacture controllers required to sustain the ALCM. Work will be performed in Heath, Ohio; and Fort Walton Beach, Florida, and is expected to be completed by June 29, 2033. This award was a sole-source acquisition. Fiscal 2026 missile procurement funds in the amount of \$2,867,534 are being obligated at the time of award. Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center, Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma, is the contracting activity (FA8128-26-D-B002).

Govini, Arlington, Virginia, was awarded a \$31,000,000 firm-fixed-price contract for the Intercontinental Ballistic Missile enterprise. This contract provides an integrated view of the ICBM industrial base and supply chains through software as a service to identify current and future supply chain gaps and assess risks. Work will be performed at Hill Air Force Base, Utah, and is expected to be complete by June 2029. This contract was a competitive acquisition, and four offers were received. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test, and evaluation funds in the amount of \$1,802,906 will be obligated at time of award. The Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center, Hill Air Force Base, Utah, is the contracting activity (FA8204-26-C-B003).

Northrop Grumman Systems Corp., Mclean, Virginia, was awarded an undefinitized contract action letter contract with a not-to-exceed ceiling value of \$49,000,000 for Joint Tactical Ground Station (JTAGS) sustainment. This contract provides contractor logistics support and engineering services for the JTAGS program. Work will be performed in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and various locations globally, and is expected to be completed by June 30, 2027. This contract was a sole source acquisition. Fiscal 2026 operations and maintenance funds in the amount of \$13,500,000; and fiscal 2026 research, development, test, and evaluation funds in the amount of \$5,500,000 are being obligated at time of award. Space Systems Command Directorate of Contracting, Peterson Space Force Base, Colorado, is the contracting activity (FA8815-26-C-B002).

Tecolote Research Inc., Goleta, California, has been awarded a maximum \$20,313,416 cost-plus-incentive-fee and firm-fixed-price modification (P00092) to a previously awarded contract (FA8807-19-F-0008) for Space and Missile Systems Center acquisition and financial support efforts. The modification brings the total cumulative face value of the contract to \$167,239,011 from \$158,279,498. Work will be performed in El Segundo, California, and other government and contractor locations and is expected to be completed by March 31, 2027. Fiscal 2026 research, development, test and evaluation funds in the amount of \$8,959,512 are being obligated at time of award. Space Systems Command, Los Angeles Air Force Base, California, is the contracting activity.
